We also hope to launch an updated logo which will capture some of the Home's key characteristics... colours which celebrate the blue tiles from the roof of the old White House part of HOLF, some green to celebrate the sensory garden, trees and God's amazing creation...we hope it will also show warmth in a homely environment and reveal God's love, care and support for our residents...we plan a more abstract but simple image...so watch this space for an unveiling early next year.

Meanwhile, we look forward to the coming season of winter and yet the comfort and joy of advent leading us to Christmas celebrations as we celebrate his glorious birth.

- 3. to engage and employ adults with special needs in the Home in the office, the laundry, our kitchens etc
- 4. to collaborate with other like minded NGOs...to play to their strengths and to ours!
